INTRODUCTION



1.1. Scope

A **Sustainable Procurement Policy** aims to minimize environmental impact, ensure fair labor practices, and promote ethical business practices while balancing cost and quality. **Rovensa's sustainable procurement policy** is a set of guidelines and practices designed to ensure that an organization's purchasing decisions consider **environmental**, **social**, and **economic impacts**. The goal is to procure goods and services in a way that reduces negative effects on the environment, promotes fair labor practices, and supports ethical business conduct. This involves choosing energy-efficient products, made from sustainable materials, and produced under fair working conditions. Additionally, it includes engaging with suppliers to encourage sustainable practices and implementing monitoring mechanisms to ensure compliance and continuous improvement

1.9. Our Commitment

It is in this context that **the Rovensa Group undertakes** that **all Companies** develop their activities, and the acquisition process in particular, following the following principles:

- Preferably, and under equal conditions, choose local/national suppliers, minimizing the carbon footprint of the products sold and enhancing the socioeconomic well-being of the geographies where the Group operates;
- Use only suppliers that comply with the laws, agreements and regulations stipulated at the local, national and international level as applicable to the supply chain. In this sense, they must apply practices considered acceptable to the sector and maintain the history of updated records as well as permits, certificates and licenses following the requirements of each product or service to be provided;
- ❖ We should ensure that all suppliers act in a manner consistent with our values and code of conduct. We should guarantee that the suppliers act in an ethical and socially responsible manner and adhere to international standards on human rights (e.g. European Convention on Human Rights, United Nations (UN) Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights, ILO Declaration on Fundamental Principles and Rights at Work and OECD Guidelines for Multinational Enterprises), environmental protection and appropriate working conditions, including the prohibition of child labor, through documents or certificates attesting to these acts;
- Seeking to know the reality of its suppliers, to detect early signs of possible abuses or non-compliance with the <u>Supplier Code of</u> <u>Conduct;</u>
- Suppliers must adopt strategies aimed at reducing the environmental impacts of their operations, including the consumption of natural resources, the source of raw materials, waste management, water discharge, gas emissions, and avoiding the accidental release of hazardous materials into the environment. environment and the local community;
- Suppliers must prevent or mitigate potential spills or emissions of hazardous gases and any activity that may have a negative impact. Policies for the application of widely recognized sustainability standards and certifications must be adopted their practices must be in line with the principles of the circular economy. In this sense, technologies and processes that are less harmful to the environment must be implemented and must ensure continuous improvement to reduce the negative impacts of its activity over time with more efficient means.


Legal Reasons

Business Ethics

We expect our suppliers to uphold similar principles, including honesty, fairness, and integrity in all business dealings. Suppliers should avoid conflicts of interest, maintain confidentiality, and ensure compliance with anti-corruption laws and regulations.

Rovensa uses effective whistleblowing mechanisms that are essential for ensuring accountability and transparency in business practices, as laid out in the United Nations (UN) Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights, particularly Principle 31, which emphasizes the importance of non-judicial grievance mechanisms being legitimate, accessible, predictable, equitable, transparent, rights-compatible, a source of continuous learning, and based on engagement and dialogue. Rovensa has established a Whistleblowing Channel to facilitate the reporting of any questions or suspected violations of their Code of Conduct and Supplier Code of Conduct, ensuring that employees, suppliers, contractors, stakeholders, and third parties adhere to the highest standards of ethics, honesty, and integrity.

2.6. SMART Goals and Targets

This includes:

- Reduce the carbon footprint from our supply chain: By 2030, reduce Scope 1 and 2 GHG emissions by 50% and Scope 3 GHG emissions by 25%.
- Increase local sourcing of our materials from local suppliers
- Enhance supplier compliance by ensuring that our suppliers comply with our sustainability standards and our Supplier Code of Conduct

2.7. Risk Mitigation in the Value Chain

At Rovensa, we are committed to identifying and mitigating risks in our value chain by:

- Conducting Risk Assessments: Regularly evaluating potential risks related to environmental, social, and governance factors.
